Rules and Regulations:

1. The dairy cattle show is open to all, irrespective of residence.
2. An entry fee of \$5 is required for each animal entered, payable when entry is made.
3. Non 4-H families, farms and/or exhibitors will receive 1 Season-sticker for 1-3 paid entries and 1 additional Season pass for 4 or more paid entries. Additional Season-passes may be purchased. Additional Season-stickers will NOT be sold or issued. The Season-sticker is good for admission and parking for the driver on the fair-grounds proper. The Season pass is good for admission onto the grounds and parking in the satellite lots A, B, C, or D only.
4. Any 4-H'er wishing to exhibit in the open shows on Sunday or Thursday must pre-register and pay the \$5 entry fee per animal. Each 4-H exhibitor will receive 1 Season pass for 1-3 paid entries, and 2 Season-passes for 4 or more paid entries.
5. No entry fee deductions will be made from any premiums awarded.
6. The Registration Certificate - which will be considered as proof of identity, parentage, birth date, ownership and breeder of an animal, must be available upon request to the Cattle Superintendent or any person designated by Show Management at all times during the show. All animals must be registered in their respective herd books.

Ayrshire - Ayrshire Genetic Recovery animals which are registered in the GR stage may also be shown. The registration certificate will state "Grade Ayrshire - Genetic Recovery". Dual registered animals must show in the same breed shows if the animal is to be shown in the respective youth and open show.

Brown Swiss - Standard Registration from which is white with the green border is issued with a normal six digit Registration Number for Registered Brown Swiss Females and Certified Identity Enrollment Female (C I E). Brown Swiss step II I E Identity Enrollment animals which have a 379 plus six-digit registration number may also be shown. Registration paper is green with black border.

Guernsey - Registered Guernsey females and females in step four of the Genetic Recovery Program are eligible to show. Step four females have a "GR" prefix in their name. No other prefixes are eligible. Dual registered animals must show in the same breed shows if the animal is to be shown in the respective youth and open show.

Holstein - Holsteins with the 87 percent registered holstein Ancestry (RHA) and above are eligible to show. Dual registered animals must show in the same breed shows if the animal is to be shown in the respective youth and open show.

Jersey - Registered Jersey females and females in the step three of the Genetic Recovery Program are eligible to show. Step three animals are designated as "GR". "J1" "OA" and "PR" animals are not eligible to show.

Milking Shorthorn - Cattle must have full herdbook six digit Milking Shorthorn Registry Certificates. Tattoo numbers must correspond with the registry certificate. Milking Shorthorn females with the nine digit Birth Record certificates (begins with 36000 or 37000) are not eligible to show. Any Milking Shorthorn with black hair cannot be shown. Dual registered animals must show in the same breed shows if the animal is to be shown in the respective youth and open show.

All show entries must comply with the eligibility regulations of the breed's national show policy.

The Dairy Superintendent and staff will use all reasonable diligence to prevent errors or improper substitutions of animals. All entries must be checked and identified with a registration certificate by a Dairy Superintendent / Show Manager prior to showing. Any animal which cannot be identified by means of color markings or ear tattoo will be disqualified. Management invites the cooperation of Breed Registry Organization personnel and exhibitors in preventing errors in entering or in the showing of animals.

6. Animals must compete in individual classes to be shown in group classes.

Group Classes

Group Entries - Entries not included on original entry form must be made no later than 1:00 p.m. of the day prior to the show. Group Cards designating animals must be completed by exhibitor and handed to show management prior to entrance in ring. ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED ONCE THE BREED SHOW HAS BEGUN.

7. Any changes in entries must be made at time of check-in. Substitutions may be made within the same breed. No added entries will be accepted.
8. Exhibitors may not receive more than two premiums in any one class.
9. All champions, both juniors and seniors of each breed, must remain on the fair-grounds for the entire week.
10. All premium checks will be mailed to exhibitors.
11. All trailers must be parked at Lot E as designated by fair officials.
12. An exhibitors' meeting will be held at 7 p.m. Wednesday, Sept. 8, at Building 32.
13. Parent/Guardian will be and are responsible for conduct of minor children.
14. Exhibitors are to present a copy of Approved Animal Health Papers to superintendent upon check in. All animals exhibited must be listed on approved health paper. Original approved health papers will still be required by exhibitors to have upon arrival and until such time as reviewed by fair officials and or the Maryland Department of Agriculture (MDA) inspectors.
15. In the show ring competition, the decision of the judge is final in all cases, except where an error or misrepresentation is discovered after the placings have been announced but before the end of the show. In such cases, the final decision will be made by the Show Manager or his representative.
16. Anyone not wearing closed toed shoes will not be permitted to enter the milking parlor. (Crocs, sandals, flip flops, etc. are not permitted.)
17. Refer to general rules and regulations for additional information.

Ownership

Exhibitor - An exhibitor must be the owner or member of a partnership owning the animal. To be eligible for competition, whether singly or in groups, animals must be the bona fide property of exhibitors, except where otherwise specified. Certificate of registration showing ownership must be available for checking by the Superintendent or any person designated by Show Management prior to the day of showing. In classes for Daughter-Dam and Produce-of-Dam, animals need not be owned by exhibitors.

Animals owned in partnership (each partner being named on the registration certificate) may be entered in any class of the show under one owner's name throughout the show. Each unique partnership requires a separate entry form. However, in order for an animal owned by more than one person (any partnership) to qualify under the "Family Unit" all owners must be bona fide members of the "Family Unit". Animals owned by a syndicate, firm, or farm must be entered and shown exactly as listed on the registration certificate.

Family Unit - If a herd is registered in the names of the immediate members of a family (Member) of the farm owner (Major Exhibitor), these persons must enter the show as individual exhibitors and they may combine their entries and be considered one exhibitor. All animals must be (A.) Under the exclusive care and management of the herd owner, and (B.) Housed, health tested and production tested with the owner's herd. In order to qualify as a "Family Unit" under this rule, all animals must be tested under one ownership or as one farm unit. Once the "Family Unit" option is adopted, all animals entered from the farm must be shown under the "Family Unit." The Major exhibitor must own one or more animals in the Herd Unit. However, each individual owner must submit a separate entry blank.

A list of names of all individuals owning animals included in the "Family Unit" and the names of the "Family Unit" must be submitted with the application for entry and will be considered as one exhibitor throughout the show. When the "Family Unit" option is elected, all animals owned and exhibited by any member of the unit must be shown under the "Family Unit" entry. This decision is final on the closing date for entries (August 15).

If the "Family Unit" option is elected, and animal owned by any person in the group may be substituted for one owned by any other person in the group according to substitution rule #7. Partnership or Syndicate owned animals do not qualify under the Family Unit Rule. They must enter using a separate entry form.

Open Class Herdsmen's Contest:

Herds must consist of four or more animals. There is no other class of livestock exhibits that require such great attention to cleanliness, neatness and sanitation as does the exhibit of cattle. Realizing that the herdsman is directly responsible for the condition of the herd and the area it occupies, the Herdsmen's Contest should not only be an incentive to the herdsman, but should also add greatly to the general appearance of the barns. The herdsman awards will be presented at 7:30 a.m. Saturday, Sept. 25, during the livestock exhibitors' breakfast. **There will be no walk-in displays allowed.**

The Purebred Cattle Association Show Ring Code of Ethics

Adopted April 3, 2004

The showing of registered dairy cattle stimulates and sustains interest in the breeding of registered dairy cattle. It is also an important part of the promotion, merchandising and breeding program of many breeders. For these reasons, the Purebred Dairy Cattle Association (PDCA) believes that it is in the best interest of all the breeders of registered dairy cattle to maintain a reputation of integrity in dairy cattle shows and to present a wholesome and progressive image of dairy cattle in the show ring.

PDCA endorses the Show Ring Code of Ethics for all dairy breed shows and pledges its full cooperative support for its enforcement to show management, show judges, and the national breed association.

The application of this Code of Ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this Code of Ethics. Dairy cattle exhibitors shall, at all times, deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship.

It is recognized that there are certain practices in the proper care and management of dairy cattle that are necessary in the course of moving dairy cattle to and between shows that are advisable to keep them in a sound, healthy state so they might be presented in the show ring in a natural, normal condition. At all times, exhibition livestock shall be treated in a humane manner and in accordance with dairy quality assurance practices so as to protect the health, safety and welfare of the livestock and the consuming public. No person shall present for exhibition or exhibit an animal which he or she knows, or has reason to suspect, is affected with or has been exposed to a dangerously contagious or infectious disease, or illegal or non-approved use of drugs, medication and or prohibited substance, or residue.

The position of the Purebred Dairy Cattle Association is that all animals presented for exhibition shall be in their natural conformation and structure, free of any alteration or modification by injection or internal or external administration of any substance or by any involvement in unethical fitting.

Grooming and Preparation

Dairy cattle exhibitions are conducted under standards for evaluating confirmation established by the PDCA Unified Score Card (1994), with specific breed characteristics taken into consideration by the show judge. In this connection, animals will be groomed and prepared for the judge's evaluation in order to display the animal's natural contour, conformation, performance and mobility. Specifically:

1. External applications of cosmetics that affect only appearance may be used, including by way of example hoof polishes and false switches.
2. The maximum allowable length of naturally growing hair anywhere on the top line is not to exceed 1 inch. Exhibitors will be required to comply with this rule before the animal is allowed to enter the ring.
3. Addition of foreign objects, including but not limited to hair or hair substitutes, cloth or fiber, to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body is prohibited.
4. Externally sealing the teat end with a preparation that does not harm the animal's skin is permissible. Natural teat placement will be given preference over artificially positioned teats.

Violations: False, Deceptive or Unacceptable Practices

These practices are violations of the Code of Ethics and will be reported to show management and may be reported to the respective national breed associations:

1. Misrepresenting the age and/or milk status of the animal for the class in which it is shown.
2. Treating the animal, particularly the udder, internally or externally:
 - a. with an irritant or counterirritant, or other substance to artificially improve the conformation,
 - b. using a device to artificially create or enhance the udder crease,
 - c. using substances as detected by testings that artificially change the udder,
 - d. plugging teat canals with foreign substances.
3. Surgical or unethical insertion of any matter under the skin or into body cavities, performed to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body (e.g., administration of fluid via a stomach tube or other similar apparatus to fill the rumen), though not to preclude practices required or involved in normal management.
4. Criticizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring or other conduct detrimental to the breed or the show.
5. Challenging, threatening, or interfering with an ethics committee appointed by show management to monitor the animals on exhibit on the show grounds.

Exhibitor Responsibility

The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter and/or absolutely responsible person (hereinafter referred to as "Exhibitor") for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, milk, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Materials may also be collected by ultrasound and photographic methods and by direct examination of animal.

The act of entering an animal is giving consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter and/or absolutely responsible person (the "Exhibitor") to have disciplinary action for violation of this Show Ring Code of Ethics taken by show management, the state in which the show occurs, and/or the national dairy breed association with recourse.

Show Ethics Committee

Each show should have an Ethics Committee. The make-up of this committee should include official breed representatives, representative(s) of show management (e.g., dairy cattle show superintendent, General Manager), the official show veterinarian, and Extension representative.

The Ethics Committee will be responsible for monitoring violations of the Show Ring Code of Ethics. The Ethics Committee will investigate the report of any violation and determine the accuracy of the allegation. The Ethics committee will have the authority to inspect the animals and related material to determine if violations have occurred.

Violations: Reporting and Investigation

Complaints of alleged violations can be reported to the breed superintendent, the show superintendent, show management, and/or the Ethics Committee.

Before an Animal is Shown

If the Ethics Committee suspects that a violation of the Show Ring Code of Ethics will occur if the animal is shown, and that violation is reasonably well established before the animal is shown, the Ethics Committee will submit a report to show management.

Show management will discuss the violation with the Exhibitor.

1. If, at the Exhibitor's discretion, the animal in question is not shown, no violation will have occurred.
2. If the Exhibitor wishes to challenge that a violation occurred, he/she/they will have the opportunity to appeal to the Ethics Committee. If its decision is not changed, the Exhibitor will be denied opportunity to exhibit the animal in question.

During and After and Animal is Shown

All animals are subject to examination during judging. The judge and Ethics Committee are instructed to examine the top five (5) animals in each class closely for violations of the Show Ring Code of Ethics. When a violation may have occurred, a milk out may be called for. This call may be by breed association rule, or by request of an authorized representative of the national breed association, the judge, the Ethics committee, or show management.

If an animal is exhibited and a violation of the Show Ring Code of Ethics is subsequently suspected, investigated, and determined to have occurred, the violation will be reported to the Ethics Committee and show management for action. The Exhibitor will be notified of the violation and the supporting evidence and invited to defend or explain the allegations.

Violations are subject to the disciplinary provisions of show management, the state in which the show occurs, and the national dairy breed association. Sanctions may include any one, or combination of the following:

- forfeiture or return of awards, prizes, premiums or proceeds;
- written letter of reprimand to the owner, exhibitor, fitter and/or absolutely responsible person (the "Exhibitor");
- disqualification of the exhibition livestock from an exhibition;
- disqualification of the Exhibitor from the show;
- publication of offense.

Disqualification may include any or all shows and classes and may be for any number of years.

2. An entry fee of \$15 is required for each animal, which includes the cost of mulch. Entry fees are payable when entries are made. Entry fees of \$30 is required for each animal in the Texas Longhorn Show.
3. Non 4-H families, farms and/or exhibitors will receive 1 Season sticker for 1-3 paid entries and 1 additional Season pass for 4 or more paid entries. Additional Season-passes may be purchased. Additional Season-stickers will NOT be sold or issued. The Season-sticker is good for admission and parking for the driver on the fair-grounds proper. The Season-pass is good for admission onto the grounds and parking in the satellite lots A, B, C, or D only.
4. Any 4-Her wishing to exhibit in the open show on Tuesday or Saturday must pre-register and pay the appropriate entry fee stated in rule 2. Each 4-H exhibitor will receive 1 Season pass for 1-3 paid entries, and 2 Season passes for 4 or more paid entries.

5. No deductions will be made from premiums awarded.
6. All animals entered for competition in the beef cattle classes must be registered in the recognized herd books of the respective breeds.
7. Animals competing as individuals are eligible to compete in group classes.
8. Any animal that is "dual" registered in both the beef and dairy breed books may be shown as either beef or dairy, but not both.
9. All premium checks will be mailed to exhibitors.
10. Senior Yearlings are eligible to be shown with natural calf at side, but are not eligible to be shown as cow/calf pair.
11. All animals must be identified by a tattoo.
12. Shorthorn cattle (bulls, heifers, steers) must have RED print registration papers. Appendix cattle will have GREEN print registration papers and must be shown in the All Other Registered Breed section.
13. Refer to general rules and regulations for additional information.

Natural Colored

4. Sheep are not to be washed, clipped or blocked so as not to damage the wool.
5. Dung locks may be trimmed.

Carcass Contest

1. Open to Frederick County residents only.
2. Only one entry per exhibitor.
3. Lambs must be ewe or wether (no ram lambs) born in 2010. Lambs will be mouthed.
4. Entry fee is \$5 per lamb for Frederick County 4-H'ers or members of the Frederick County Sheep Breeders.
5. Lambs must be owned by the exhibitor for at least 60 days prior to the contest.
6. Lambs will be weighed immediately before the on-hoof judging. Lambs must weigh between 95 and 145 pounds.
7. Lambs must be completely slick shorn (no butt wool) within seven days of the contest.
8. Lambs are subject to health rules. Lambs showing signs of testicle development or drug residue at slaughter will be disqualified.

Rules and Regulations:

1. The dairy and boer goat show is open to all, irrespective of residence.
2. An entry fee of \$5 per dairy goat and boer goat, payable when entries are made.
3. Non 4-H families, farms and/or exhibitors will receive 1 Season sticker for 1-3 paid entries and 1 additional Season pass for 4 or more paid entries. Additional Season passes may be purchased. Additional Season stickers will NOT be sold or issued. The Season sticker is good for admission and parking for the driver on the fairgrounds proper. The Season pass is good for admission onto the grounds and parking in the satellite lots A, B, C, or D only.
4. Any 4-H'er wishing to exhibit in the open show either Saturday must pre-register and pay the \$5 entry fee per animal. Each 4-H exhibitor will receive 1 Agri-Pass for 1-3 paid entries, and 2 Agri-Passes for 4 or more paid entries.
5. No deductions will be made from premiums awarded.
6. Exhibitors must provide their own bedding and cleaning tools. Animals must be removed from the grounds within two hours after show is completed. Anyone not cleaning their pens will forfeit premiums.
7. American Dairy Goat Association (ADGA) and American Boer Goat Association (ABGA) official show rules govern. At time of arrival, all animals must be accompanied by registration, recordation or stamped ADGA or ABGA duplicate application for animals under six months of age.

8. The Junior and Senior Dairy Goat Shows are seperately sanctioned.
9. The Boer Goat Shows will be sanctioned by the ABGA & USBGA.
10. Permanent champions may be shown in the appropriate age class, or the Champion Challenge class but not both.
11. Substitutions may be made within the same breed and class and under the same exhibitor at check-in only.
12. Exhibitors must provide tattoo numbers in both ears on entry forms.
13. Age of animal is determined as of September 18, 2010.
14. Animals will be released at end of show or at the discretion of the Fair Board. Any exhibitor who removes animals without the permission of the Fair Board or violates any other rules will be banned from future shows as will any animals registered in their name and may forfeit premiums. Vehicles and trailers are NOT allowed in the driveway between the goat barn and the show ring while the show is in process.
15. All premium checks will be mailed to exhibitors.
16. Refer to general rules and regulations for additional information.
17. All animals will be housed in pens provided by the fair. No animals will be allowed to be shown from the truck/trailer/vehicle.

1. The entries in this department are by invitation only.
2. An entry fee of \$1 per bird is required, payable when entry is made.
3. All exhibitors whose total entry fee is \$10 or more will be given one Season pass.
4. There will be no farm flocks, and no classes for trios.
5. Premiums will be awarded to all variety of poultry recognized in the Standard of Perfection; and ornamental varieties as well as non-standard breeds and varieties recognized distinctly as such by the superintendent.
6. All birds must be pullorum tested. Send certificates with entry plus A-1 test every 90 days.
7. During the exhibition, all specimens will be under the control of the superintendent and cannot be removed without his consent. A poultry technician will be on hand to make a daily inspection of all birds on exhibition; any bird showing signs of sickness or disease will be removed from the poultry building.
8. Protests must be made in writing. See complete protest guidelines on page 9.
9. The term specimen implies anything for which a premium is offered. The cock and hen are specimens hatched prior to 2009; Cockerel and Pullet are specimens hatched during 2009.
10. Any exhibitor interfering with a judge while discharging his duties, or interfering with or handling any specimen or exhibition other than his own shall forfeit all premiums that may have been awarded.

11. Any exhibits left in the building after noon, Sunday, Sept. 26 will be done so at the owner's risk.
12. Exhibitors are limited to two entries per class per variety.
13. Specimens will be fed and cared for at the expense of the fair.
14. All premiums paid on the following sliding scale.
15. All premium checks will be mailed to exhibitors.
