1. Entries for **BEER, WINES, CIDER AND MEAD** will be received 10 a.m.-2 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 10, 2011 at the Farm & Garden Building.
2. All other entries will be received 3-8 pm Wednesday, Sept. 14 and 3-8 p.m. Thursday, Sept. 15, 2011.
3. All entries must be made in the name of the actual producer, properly labeled, designating each variety and the specific quantity exhibited to obtain premium.
4. All entries must be grown in Frederick County, except in Section 4.
5. Exhibitors must purchase a Season Exhibitors' Pass for \$10.00 for admission for each day of the fair.
6. Exhibitors will be allowed **three items** on one ticket in all departments.
7. No article in the department will be released to exhibitors before 10 a.m. Sunday, Sept. 25, 2011, and all articles be removed that day before 3 p.m. **THERE WILL BE NO MONDAY PICKUP AT BUILDING 14A. ITEMS CAN BE PICKED UP ON MONDAY AT THE ADMINISTRATION BUILDING.** All premiums will be paid in the form of a check which will be mailed after the fair.

8. All items not picked up within 24 hours after the fair will be disposed of.
9. **Tickets purchased in another building will not be accepted toward entries in Farm & Garden Building.**
10. **Due to the uncertainty of any premium assistance which we may receive from The Maryland Agricultural Fair Board, The Great Frederick Fair, Inc. reserves the right to adjust any and all premium offerings.**

## DEPARTMENT K - POMOLOGICAL DEPARTMENT BUILDING 14A

### Rules and Regulations:

1. **Entries will be received from 3-8 p.m. Wednesday, Sept. 14, 2011 and from 3-8 p.m. Thursday, Sept. 15, 2011.**
2. All entries are limited to Frederick County residents, except Section 1 is open to any exhibitor.
3. Exhibitors must purchase a Season Exhibitors' Pass for \$10.00.
4. Exhibitors are not permitted more than one entry of each variety or kind in any of the classes.
5. Exhibitors are allowed **three items** on one ticket in Sections 1-8.
6. All fruits and nuts will be judged on basis of desirable and standard form, size and color for the variety, also uniformity of form, size, and color of fruits exhibited. Freedom from damage and blemish caused by insects or disease, also condition of fruit will be given high consideration.
7. **Due to the uncertainty of any premium assistance which we may receive from The Maryland Agricultural Fair Board, The Great Frederick Fair, Inc. reserves the right to adjust any and all premium offerings.**
8. Refer to general rules and regulations for additional information.

### SECTION 1-HONEY AND BEESWAX

#### Rules and Regulations:

1. Displays may include pictures and charts, but not bakery products, canned goods or other food related items that could be edible by the public during display. Maximum width of display is five feet.
2. All honey and beeswax must be the property of the exhibitor and must have been produced by him/her within a 15-month period prior to entry.
3. All honey exhibited must have been gathered and ripened in a natural way by honey bees.
4. No exhibitor's name or label will be allowed on any entry except Classes 18 & 19.
5. All cut comb honey must be packed in clear cut comb boxes, measuring 4 1/8 inches x 4 1/8 inches, or in clear round cut comb plastic containers approximately 4 inches in diameter, and for viewing entire comb portion.
6. A copy of the judge's score sheet will be provided for each entry at the close of the exhibition.
7. Competent judging will be provided. Judges may withhold prizes for insufficient

merit and remove from public view any entry or part thereof which, in his/her opinion, discredits the exhibition.

8. A copy of the Standards for Honey Judging in Maryland will be available upon request.
9. The exhibitor will select the class. If needed, assistance will be available for selecting the correct class. The superintendent/judge reserves the right to change the class selected, if necessary.
10. All extracted honey shall receive equal points on color within the class.
11. Frame of honey must be supported vertically in a sealed rigid display case with transparent windows for viewing entire comb portion. (No plastic foundations.)
12. Bee craft includes drawings, paintings, pottery, needlework, batik, carvings, wax moldings depicting honey bees and beekeeping activities, etc.
13. All extracted honey entered in Classes 2-5 must be entered in standard one pound glass or clear plastic flat-faced standard honey jars. ONLY ONE ENTRY PER CLASS, PER FAMILY OR HOUSEHOLD.
14. All chunk honey (Class 8) and finely granulated honey (Class 10) must be exhibited in standard one pound round glass honey jars. (No plastic jars for this entry.)
15. Pollen will be exhibited in one pound round or standard flat-faced honey jars, either glass or clear plastic jars. All pollen will be dried, 1/2 pound minimum or to fill line on jar (3 jars) cleaned and dust free. Pollen entries may be of the single color or multi-color type, but must be 3 of the same entry.
16. Propolis - 1/2 lb. minimum, cleaned and free of wax, honey & debris. Padded flat between wax paper sheets or in a plastic bag.
17. Gift packs must include in one or more products of the hive, but may also include other items that enhance the appeal or promote the use of hive products. Gift packs should be suitable for personal gift use regardless of commercial applications. The gift pack should be a box, basket or other suitable container. Labels are permitted on gift packs.
18. Mailable gift packs must be prepared and displayed in a container and packing material that is suitable for shipping.
19. Bee related photography (Class 22) will be judged strictly on photographic content. Framing is optional, but may enhance presentation points.
20. BEEKEEPERS ENTERING FOR THE FIRST TIME ONLY (CLASS 24 & 25), MAY EXHIBIT HONEY IN 1 PINT GLASS CANNING JARS OR 1 LB. standard GLASS OR PLASTIC FLAT-FACED HONEY JARS.
