#### Rules & Regulations:

1. The dairy goat show is open to all, irrespective of residence.
2. An entry fee of \$5 per entry, payable when entries are made.
3. See Page 33 for pass policy.
4. No deductions will be made from premiums awarded.
5. Exhibitors must provide their own bedding and cleaning tools. Animals must be removed from the grounds within two hours after show is completed. Anyone not cleaning their pens will forfeit premiums.
6. American Dairy Goat Association (ADGA) official show rules govern. At time of arrival, all animals must be accompanied by registration, recordation or stamped ADGA, duplicate application for animals under six months of age.
7. The Junior and Senior Dairy Goat Shows are separately sanctioned.
8. Permanent champions may be shown in the appropriate age class, or the Champion Challenge class but not both.
9. Substitutions may be made within the same breed and class and under the same exhibitor at check-in only.
10. Exhibitors must provide tattoo numbers on entry forms (*clear and legible*).
11. Age of animal is determined as of September 19, 2020.

12. Exhibitors are expected to bring adequate handlers, especially if they are showing in both the Senior Doe Show and the Junior Doe Show. Unless there are a large number of goats involved, the shows will not wait just because an exhibitor is showing in the other ring.
13. Refer to the release schedule on pages 42 and 43 for release times. Any exhibitor who removes animals without the permission of the Fair Board or violates any other rules will be banned from future shows as will any animals registered in their name and may forfeit premiums.
14. All premium checks will be mailed to exhibitors.
15. All animals will be housed in pens provided by the fair. No animals will be allowed to be shown from the truck/trailer/vehicle.
16. Refer to general rules and regulations for additional information.

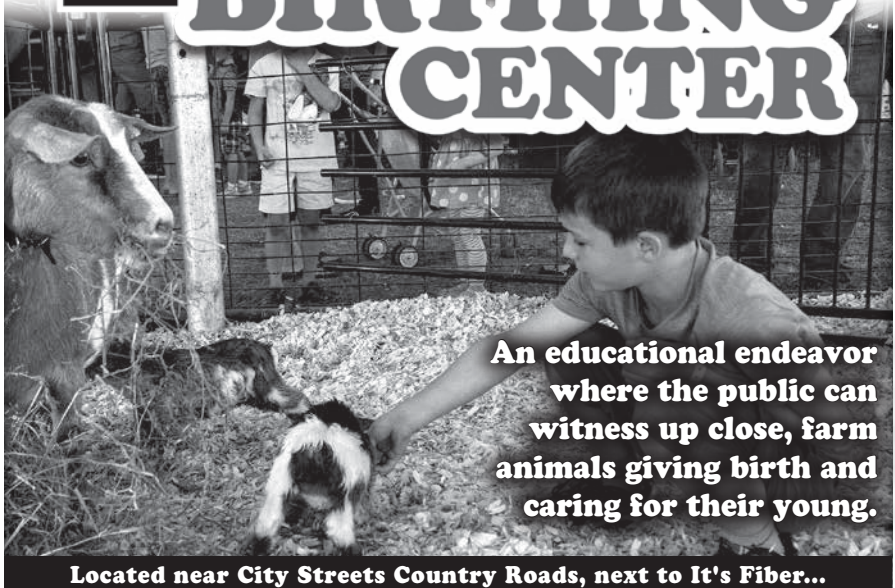
